DIFFERENCE BETWEEN WASHINGTON STATE THESPIANS AND EdTA

Washington State Thespians is a Chapter of the Educational Theatre Association (EdTA). If you start a Thespian Troupe through EdTA you are automatically a member of the Washington State Chapter.

CHARTER A TROUPE

When you Charter a Troupe for the first time, you may induct all those whom you believe are committed members of your theatre department and who, if you had had a troupe, would qualify for Thespian membership. As a Troupe Director you may organize your troupe in a variety of ways to make it work for your school. THESPIAN TROUPE COST

- One-time charter fee \$95
- One-time induction fees: \$30 per student (6 minimum = \$180)
- Minimum total to charter \$370

TEACHER THESPIAN MEMBERSHIP

If you were inducted in high school you are a Thespian for life. As an adult, however, you do not qualify for the same benefits as they are specific to high school students. There are different memberships for your situation. If you Charter a Thespian Troupe you are automatically a Thespian Troupe Director and receive those benefits. http://www.edta.org/membership/join/

NON-THESPIAN PARTICIPATION IN THESPIAN EVENTS

Non-Thespians can participate and be adjudicated at Washington Thespian regional IE Events, attend State Thespian Festival, and in-service. If a student qualifies at regional IE and wants to participate in IE showcase auditions at State or NIES at the International Thespian Festival in June, they must be an inducted Thespian at the time of registration. Students must also be a thespian to audition for scholarships at Festival.

INTERNATIONAL THESPIAN FESTIVAL

Thespian: \$790 (plus transportation/event/audition fees) Non-Thespian: \$820 (plus transportation/event/audition fees)

DO YOU NEED TO QUALIFY TO ATTEND THE INTERNATIONAL THESPIAN FESTIVAL (ITF)?

Anyone may attend the International Thespian Festival (ITF) in June. There are many technical and performance opportunities that do NOT require any qualification. You simply sign up when you register your troupe. However, if you wish to audition for scholarships, collegiate programs, or participate in Individual Events (NIES), you must be an inducted member of a Thespian Troupe.

To participate in NIES at the International Thespian Festival in June, you must qualify at one of the Washington Thespians regional IE events (NW, SW, or East). Your overall average adjudicated score must by in the superior column of your particular event rubric.

To bring a full length play or musical to ITF, your show must be adjudicated by EdTA's national adjudicators in your home school. See the Thespian website for more details. 'Chapter Select' cuttings are adjudicated at the State Thespian Festival.

TECHNICAL EVENTS

Each regional IE Event (East, NW, SW) gives students the opportunity to present technical projects in a variety of categories including: costume design, costume construction, scenic design, lighting design, stage management, sound design, and theatre marketing. Students who qualify at their regional IE can present for showcase at state and/or International Thespian Festival.

TECH OLYMPICS are part of the Washington State Thespian Festival each year. The TECH OLYMPICS are a hands-on competition based on technical skills.

THESPIAN SCHOLARSHIPS

Students applying for scholarships at the State Thespian Festival must be an inducted thespian. Students must pre-register and fill out the scholarship application and have a Troupe Director's Letter of Recommendation turned in by the deadline. The application and other information are located on the www.washingtonstatethespians.com website.

NON-TEACHERS AS TROUPE LEADERS

If your local high school does not have a Thespian Troupe and you are unsure if the teacher wants to take on the duties of establishing a new troupe, a volunteer parent can serve as Troupe Director. It is important the Troupe Director be dedicated and work closely with the theatre teacher.

HOW TO CHARTER A JR. THESPIAN TROUPE
